III. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. SHOW CONDITIONS

Competition opened to the NRHA members and/or National Federations members all over the world.

Riders and owners must be current NRHA members, horses must have a NRHA competition license.

Riders must hold citizenship or permanent residency in the country they represent.

If a rider represents a country other than his nationality one year and his address changes, he will only be able to represent the country of his nationality the following year.

A Rider / Horse combination can only enter in one division, and a horse cannot be ridden in more than one division.

Each Nation can present a maximum of 6 riders in the divisions Junior, Young Non-Pro, Young Pro, Non-Pro (including the wildcards), Open (including the Wildcards) and Prime Time Non.

For each of these divisions, the list of the 4 riders who will represent their nation must be communicated to the organization by the team chiefs no later than two hours before the concerned divisions' draw parties.

For these divisions, the 3 best scores to count in the Team Competition and a minimum of 3 riders are needed to present a team.

Each Nation can present a maximum of 4 riders in the division Children 10 – 13 and the list of the 3 riders who will represent their nation must be communicated to the organization by the team chiefs no later than two hours before the Children 10 -13 draw party.

For the Children 10 – 13 division, the 2 best scores will count in the Team Competition and a minimum of 2 riders are needed to present a team and alliances may be made if 2 or 3 nations have only 1 rider.

Each Nation can present a maximum of 4 riders in the PARA riders division and the list of the 3 riders who will represent their nation must be communicated to the organization by the team chiefs no later than two hours before the PARA riders draw party.

For the PARA rider's division, the 2 best scores will count in the Team Competition and a minimum of 2 riders are needed to present a team and alliances may be made if 2 or 3 nations have only 1 rider.

If a Para rider is additionally qualified in another division, the rider may compete in Para Reining as well as in the qualified division, provided he rides 2 different horses.

Two goes are offered in each division:

- 1st go, Team competition and qualification for 2nd go (Individual Finals)
- 2nd go, Individual Finals (20 best scores plus ties from 1st go)

Age of athletes and horses per division:

Qualification conditions:

Scoring one time in a World Reining approved class during NRHA approved shows between September 1st,2025 to May 31,2026:

- 67 for Children 10 – 13 riders, or multiples if 2, 3 or more judges (134, 201).
- 68 for Junior 14 – 18 riders, or multiples if 2, 3 or more judges (136, 204).
- 70 for Young Non Pro 19 – 25 riders, or multiples if 2, 3 or more judges (140, 210).
- 70 for Young Pro 19 – 25 riders, or multiples if 2, 3 or more judges (140, 210).
- 70 for Non Pro riders, or multiples if 2, 3 or more judges (140, 210).
- 71 for Open riders, or multiples if 2, 3 or more judges (142, 213).
- 69 for Prime-Time Non Pro riders, or multiples if 2, 3 or more judges (138, 207).

World Reining will recognize qualifying scores made in these instances.

Para Reining riders are automatically qualified.

Division definitions.

Children 10 -13: Any person that reached the age of 10 (January 1st) including the year in which they reach the age of 13 is allowed to take part in Children Reining Competitions. Stallions are not permitted and helmet is mandatory at any time.

Junior 14 - 18: Any person That reached the age of 14 (January 1st) including the year in which they reach the age of 18 is allowed to take part in Junior Reining Competitions. Stallions are not permitted in this division, but a junior rider may be upgraded to compete in the Young Riders division, on the condition that the rider has achieved the minimum score of 70/140/210 in his qualifying class. Helmet is mandatory at any time.

Young Non-Pro 19 - 25: Any person having a NRHA Non-Pro status and that reached the age of 19 (January 1st) including the year in which they reach the age of 25 is allowed to take part in Reining competitions for Young Non-Professional Riders.

Young Pro 19 - 25: Any person that reached the age of 19 (January 1st) including the year in which they reach the age of 25 is allowed to take part in Reining competitions for Young Professional Riders.

Non-Pro: Any person having a NRHA Non-Pro status and no age restriction.

Open: No status and age restriction.

Prime time Non-Pro: Any person having a NRHA Non-Pro status and that reached the age of 50 (January 1st) is allowed to take part in Prime-time Non-Professional Riders competitions.

A rider may be upgraded to a higher division provided he has the right status achieved the minimum score for that division in the qualifying rounds.

Para Reining Riders: No age restrictions, the World Para Reining rules will be applied.

2. ENTRIES, PAYMENTS & ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

Entries

The stall fee includes the rent from June 27th in the morning until July 5th in the morning. Stalls and entries must be paid at least on June 27, 2026, by check payable to PURE EXPERIENCE by BO RANCH (the check must be sent to Pure Experience By Bo Ranch, 6 route Achères, 77760 La Chapelle La Reine, France) or by wire transfer before the arrival.

The organizer reserves the right to change the conditions up to the entry deadline, postpone or cancel the event on his sole decision. In case of cancellation paid entry fees will be refunded.

After 16 June 2026, no cancellation permitted: Office charge, doping fee, entries and stall bookings must be paid, excluding entries if there is a veterinarian certificate (or medical certificate) at the time of the cancellation.

With the submission of this entry, the rider/horse owner accepts all show conditions, the medication regulations and insurances. The horse's ID paper (horse passport) and an additional health certificate for all horses must be presented at the show office. Signing the entry form confirm that the horse is free of contagious diseases and that a third party insurance has been taken for riders, owners and horses. The rider or his national representative commits themselves to pay the entry and stable fees, even if the event of his withdrawal for valid reasons. Changes in bookings and entries may only be made through the show office. Rider/horse owner or/and their national representative will follow all instructions by the show management. All decisions made by the show management are binding and final. Incomplete or unsigned participation requests or those without deposits will not be considered or processed.

WARNING : Health certificate for all horses must be provided upon arrival at the showground.

Payments

No payment, no show. If we have not received your payment before the show and at least June 27, 2026, you will not be allowed to compete.

National representatives must send us your bank details in advance. We will not follow up with you to obtain them or to process your payments.

Payments will be made after receipt of the results of the anti-doping tests (approximately 30 days).

The official registration of national teams is completed and accepted by the organisation designated for this purpose by the respective country.

The national representative appointed by their country undertakes to submit the various lists to Show Management by the indicated dates.

2. SHOW INFORMATION:

A separate file called **WRCC'26 Show Information** contains all information about Entry fees, Stabling fees, Time schedule, Added money and Breakdown of the prize money for all the divisions.

A minimum number of participants is required for a competition to take place.

In each division, at least three teams must participate for a team championship to take place.

Prize money for missing places will not be distributed.

The individual event will take place, if there are at least 5 nations and 20 riders in the go round, 50%, (a minimum of 10 plus ties) will go through to the finals. Prize money for the missing places will not be distributed.

No scores and 0 scores cannot enter a final.

4. DIVERSE:

Wild cards.

Following an outstanding level of interest, Wildcards will be given to the NRHA million dollars riders, the list is available on www.wrcc2026.com

These riders will be automatically qualified and, subject to their selection by their nation, will be competing under their flag of citizenship or country in which they are legal resident.

They will be included in the number of riders per divisions listed in the III. General Conditions and will have to pay the entry fees for their divisions.

We are hoping to see the highest level of competition, riding for an outstanding level of prize money and feel that an invitation to these riders will bring an additional exciting element to the show.

All other riders will have to achieve the minimum score in their division at least once at an approved World Reining Event to be qualified

Opening of entries

If any nation is unable to nominate riders by the designated time, we request that you inform us.

At this time, we will open the entries to any riders who have fulfilled the qualification criteria and hold a passport or a residence proof to the Nation they wish to represent.

We will take entries on a “first come first served” basis from riders in all the divisions, until all the places have been filled.

If the team places are filled, we will place the next riders into the individual division. If there are still more applications, they will be placed on a waiting list.

If we do not receive applications, we will assume that a Nation is unable to submit entries and therefore we will then open the entries for as many riders as possible to be offered the opportunity to compete for their Nation.

We are also looking to form “combination teams”, from riders coming from the same Continental regions if there are not enough riders from the same country to make a team.

An example could be an “European Team”.

Individual riders can request to be placed into a team or abstain.

Teams will be made one week prior to the start of the competition, depending on the number of riders available, at which point riders will be required to pay their portion of the team entry fee.

Period of an Event:

Commences one hour before the beginning of the first entry of the first class of the Event and terminates half an hour after the announcement of the final results of the last classes of the competition (Event).

Pre/Post check.

(a) Show committees have the option of using a pre-check or a post-check.

(b) When a pre-check system is used, all officiating judges are compelled to call any acts of abuse to a horse while in the arena.

If the situation arises where a chair judge calls a no score, the judge making the call should request that the exhibitor present his/her horse for inspection to the judge seated closest to the exhibitor at the completion of the pattern.

If a no score is called, the exhibitor can accept or contest the call.

If contested, the other judge(s) shall be called as soon as is practical to examine the horse and confer

Medals and Trophies.

1) Team competition.

Medals 4 x Gold (1st places), 4 x Silver (2nd places), 4 x Bronze (3rd places).

WRCC Team Trophies for the 3 first team placed.

Ribbons 4 x 1st places (blue), 4 x 2nd places (Red), 4 x 3rd places (Yellow).

Green ribbon for all the other placings.

Prizes in kind.

2) Individual competition.

Medals, Gold (1st place), Silver (2nd place), Bronze (3rd place).

WRCC Trophies, Gold (1st place), Silver (2nd place), Bronze (3rd place).

Ribbon 1st place (Big blue), 2nd place (Red), 3rd place (Yellow).

Green ribbon for all the other placings.

Prizes in kind.

Ties.

1. Teams:

- a) In case of equality of scores for the teams in the Team classification it is decided to break ties as follows for gold, silver and bronze team medals.
- b) The scores from all five Judges are added for the three counting Team Members.
- c) If still tied: the scores are added from the three counting Judges for the 3rd Horses.
- d) If still tied: the scores are added from the three counting Judges for the 2nd Horse.
- e) If still tied: the scores are added from the three counting Judges for the 1st Horse.

2. individuals:

- a) In case of equality of scores in the Individual Competition it is decided to break ties in the following manner for the gold, silver and bronze medals.
- b) There will be a run off for ties, using the same pattern and order of go as was used during the Competition, however there will not be more than one run off. The run off starts from afresh on score.
- c) Two tie-breaking Judges will be designated by OC. The tie-breaking Judge's name will not be communicated in advance.
- d) If still tied after the run off: The score of the first designated tie-breaking Judge will decide.

Arbitration Panel:

In the event of an objection by a participant, an arbitration tribunal will be convened.

The arbitration panel consists of the main judge, the veterinarian on site and a participating rider.

The names of the members of the arbitration panel will be announced before the event begins.

Riders' security:

- Minor riders

All minors must wear a correctly regulated head protection which conforms with equestrian standards, a helmet or riding hat, while riding in the facility. The chin strap must be adjusted and attached. All other protections adapted to equestrian events are authorized under the rider's responsibility. All the riders of the Children and Junior Divisions must wear a helmet. Even the ones that are upgraded if they are not 19 on January 1st, 2026.

- PARA riders

All PARA riders must wear a correctly regulated head protection which conforms with equestrian standards, a helmet or riding hat, while riding in the facility. The chin strap must be adjusted and attached. All other protections adapted to equestrian events are authorized under the rider's responsibility.

The Children, Junior and PARA divisions will have separate and dedicated training sessions.

Under conditions and control of the Stewards, Trainers will be allowed to ride for coaching the horses during and restricted to the Children, Junior and PARA training sessions.

- **HORSE HEALTH CONTROL.**

An accredited veterinarian will be present throughout the training session and during the competitions and will be responsible for monitoring the health of the horses during the event.

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Event. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be called for a veterinary examination at any time during the Event. Horses not deemed fit to compete will be disqualified.

All Horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of the Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the finals.

Horses will be examined within 30 minutes prior to their run by the official Vet who will watch the ridden horse trot a circle each way in the designated soundness check area. Any horse deemed to be unfit for competition at this time will be retired.

4. ANIMAL WELFARE & EQUINE ANTI-DOPING RULES

a) Abuse as defined in the *NRHA Handbook* is “That which a reasonable person informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be cruel, abusive and inhumane.

“A judge is thus compelled to disqualify any horse that he/she feels is being exhibited in a manner which is cruel, abusive and inhumane.

This may include the exhibition of an animal which is clearly not in a fit or sound condition, the use of abusive equipment, and/or the use of abusive showing techniques by the rider.

A judge(s) may excuse a horse at any time while in the arena for unsafe conditions or improper exhibition caused by the horse and/or the rider.

While each judge is required to disqualify any horse exhibited in the manners described above, it should be noted that in every case the exhibitor should be given the benefit of any doubt, should any doubt exist.

b) The current NRHA Animal Welfare and Medications Policy (NRHA Policy 11 – 07 – 27) will apply for this event.

The list of forbidden substances can be found on the official NRHA website www.nrha.com

Additionally, the jurisdiction of the countries hosting the event must be considered and obeyed.

The Testing can take place at any time and on any horse that is competing.

VII. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. INSURANCES

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the Event Organizer shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or Horses expressly excludes all such liability.

1.1. ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

a) Personal Accident and Health Insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a World Reining Event.

You should check with your Affiliate/National Federation to confirm if your Affiliate's/National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in a World Reining Event.

If your Affiliate/National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the Affiliate's /National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at a World Reining Event.

b) Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at a World Reining Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your Affiliate / National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

c) Press Equipment

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organizing Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.

d) Third Party Liability Insurance

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to World Reining Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The Organizer will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

1.2. HORSE INSURANCE.

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a World Reining Event.

VIII. SITE RULES, SAFETY & CONDUCT

1. BO RANCH RULES

Thank you to respect some rules:

Dogs must be kept on leash at all time

Every evening, remove all your equipment from the barn alley

Sanitary: please make sure to keep the showers / bathrooms clean

Sympathy and courtesy are required in the riding arena

No smoking in stables and indoor public places.

2. THEFT, LOSS AND DAMAGE

BO RANCH, the Organizing Committee and all service providers decline all responsibility in the event of theft, loss, damage or deterioration of any equipment, personal belongings, materials, vehicles or horses, throughout the entire site (parking areas, stables, stalls, paddocks, public and private areas). Each rider, owner, groom, exhibitor or accompanying person is responsible for taking all necessary measures to ensure the supervision and security of their property and horses.

3. SITE CLEANLINESS & RESPECT FOR FACILITIES

The BO RANCH site is private property and must be respected by all participants, accompanying persons and visitors. Each participant undertakes to keep stalls, aisles, paddocks, parking areas, grandstands, sanitary facilities and all common areas clean throughout the duration of the event. Any disposal of waste (manure, straw, cardboard, plastic, cigarette butts, etc.) must be carried out exclusively in the designated areas. Any

voluntary damage or damage resulting from improper use may result in restoration costs charged to the responsible party.

4. RESPECT FOR ANIMAL WELFARE

Every rider, owner and groom commits to always respecting the welfare of horses. It is strictly forbidden to engage in any abusive or inappropriate behavior towards the horses, to use improper equipment, or to expose them to dangerous situations. Any violation may result in immediate sanctions, including exclusion from the site or the event.

5. PRIVACY POLICY

With the submission of this entry, the rider/horse owner authorizes the processing of personal data pursuant to the European Privacy Regulation "GDPR".
